Jesus said to Nicodemus, "Only by being born anew, by water and the Spirit, can you ever see God's reign. Like the wind, new birth is both unpredictable and uncontrollable it's from above." – John 3:3, 8 In the church year, the First Sunday after Pentecost is set aside to emphasize the doctrine of the Trinity.

The witness of scripture is that in the love and unity shared among the three distinct persons of the Trinity—known traditionally as *Father*, *Son* and *Holy Spirit* or, functionally as *Creator*, *Redeemer*, and *Sustainer*—there is, indeed, one God.

While the term "Trinity" isn't found in scripture, its reality is everywhere—as in today's Gospel, the encounter between Jesus and Nicodemus, in which there is reference to Jesus, God and Spirit.

Nicodemus blind to the things of God, Jesus proposes
another way: the way of "letting go," of becoming like
a child again, listening to and following the wild and
utterly free Spirit of God.

HEBREW LESSON

Isaiah/Isaías 6:1-8

¹In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of his robe filled the temple. ²Seraphs were in attendance above him; each had six wings: with two they covered their faces, and with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew. ³And one called to another and said: 'Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory.' ⁴The pivots on the thresholds shook at the voices of those who called, and the house filled with smoke. ⁵And I said: 'Woe is me! John/Juan 3:1-17 Reverend Glaze

¹Now there was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews. ²He came to Jesus by night and said to him, 'Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God.' ³Jesus answered him, 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above.' ⁴Nicodemus said to him, 'How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?' ⁵Jesus answered, 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. ⁶What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. ⑦Do not be astonished that I said to you, "You must be born

from above." ⁸The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit.' ⁹Nicodemus said to him, 'How can these things be?' ¹⁰Jesus answered him, 'Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things? ¹¹Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony. ¹²If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? ¹³No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. ¹⁴And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, ¹⁵that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. ¹⁶For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. ¹⁷Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.
