

GENESIS / GÉNESIS 18:20-32

²⁰Then the Lord said, 'How great is the outcry against Sodom and Gomorrah and how very grave their sin! ²¹I must go down and see whether they have done altogether according to the outcry that has come to me; and if not, I will know.' ²²So the men turned from there, and went towards Sodom, while Abraham remained standing before the Lord. ²³Then Abraham came near and said, 'Will you indeed sweep away the righteous with the wicked? ²⁴Suppose there are fifty righteous within the city; will you then sweep away the place and not forgive it for the fifty righteous who are in it? ²⁵Far be it from you to do such a thing, to slay the righteous with the wicked, so that the righteous fare as the wicked! And God said, 'I will not destroy it if I find forty-five there.' ²⁹Again he spoke to God, 'Suppose forty are found there.' God answered, 'For the sake of forty I will not do it.' ³⁰Then he said, 'Oh do not let the Lord be angry if I speak. Suppose thirty are found there.' God answered, 'I will not do it, if I find thirty there.' ³¹He said, 'Let me take it upon myself to speak to the Lord. Suppose twenty are found there.' God answered, 'For the sake of twenty I will not destroy it.' ³²Then he said, 'Oh do not let the Lord be angry if I speak just once more. Suppose ten are found there.' God answered, 'For the sake of ten I will not destroy it.'

At 8:15 on the morning of August 6, 1945, an atomic bomb loaded with 9,700 pounds of uranium was dropped from a United States Air Force B-29 bomber on Hiroshima, Japan. 80,000 died instantly and more than 60,000 would die in the next few months from radioactive poisoning. Almost all were innocent civilians. Three days later a second bomb, with a plutonium core and armed with 21 kilotons of TNT, was dropped on Nagasaki—at 11:02 a.m. 75,000 died instantly. This moment of remembrance brings those sorrowful events before God once again. Our remembering expresses both lament and desire—deep sorrow for the brokenness of our world and our part in that brokenness...and, a longing for peace.

Lord Jesus, Prince of Peace, have mercy on us for living by the sword, for putting our trust in weapons of destruction, for our part in the taking of innocent life. We acknowledge our hardness of heart, our fear of others, our dismissal of the truth, our blindness, our silence, our arrogance, our failure to live as people who've been redeemed by your grace. Weep for us, Lord Jesus, for we live as if we do not know, have never even heard of, the things that make for peace. O, God, forgive us and have mercy on us as we pray together:

We invite everyone to pray the Lord's Prayer in your native language.

Our Father who art in Heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy Kingdom come. Thy will be done on Earth as it is in Heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors. Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen.
