REV. DR. A. ROY MEDLEY serves as the General Secretary of American Baptist Churches USA (ABCUSA). ABCUSA (originally named Northern Baptist Convention) was founded at Calvary in 1907 and now includes 1.3-million-members with over 5,200 congregations. Dr. Medley was drawn to the American Baptist heritage of pursuing justice and equality. American Baptists' history of peacemaking has led Dr. Medley to be in the forefront of building relationships of mutual respect and understanding between Baptists and Muslims. He has also been an advocate on behalf of the Christian community and others in Burma who have suffered human rights and religious liberty violations under the military. Dr. Medley currently serves as chair of the National Council of Churches Governing Board and carries a number of responsibilities with the Baptist World Alliance. Dr. Medley is married to Rev. Dr. Patricia Stauffer Medley, an ordained Lutheran pastor. They live in New Jersey and have two sons, one daughter-in-law, and one grandson.
