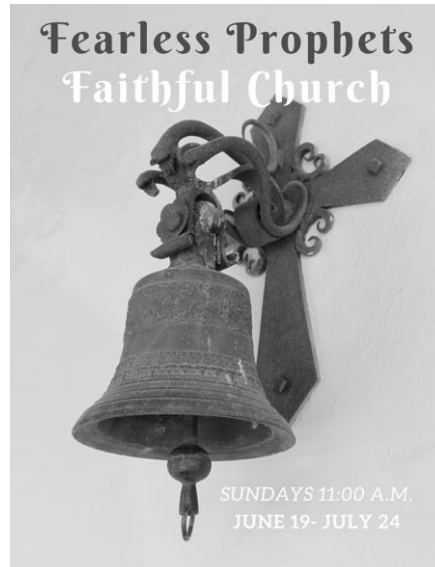

Jeremiah/Jeremías 22:1-16

¹Thus says the LORD: Go down to the house of the king of Judah, and speak there this word, ²and say: Hear the word of the LORD, O King of Judah sitting on the throne of David—you, and your servants, and your people who enter these gates. ³Thus says the LORD: Act with justice and righteousness, and deliver from the hand of the oppressor anyone who has been robbed. And do no wrong or violence to the alien, the orphan, and the widow, or shed innocent blood in this place. ⁴For if you will indeed obey this word, then through the gates of this house shall enter kings who sit on the throne of David, riding in chariots and on horses, they, and their servants, and their people. ⁵But if you will not heed these words, I swear by myself, says the LORD, that this house shall become a desolation. ⁶For thus says the LORD concerning the house of the king of Judah: You are like Gilead to me, like the summit of Lebanon; but I swear that I will make you a desert, an uninhabited city. ⁷I will prepare destroyers against you, all with their weapons; they shall cut down your choicest cedars and cast them into the fire. ⁸And many nations will pass by this city, and all of them will say one to another, “Why has the LORD dealt in this way with that great city?” ⁹And they will answer, “Because they abandoned the covenant of the LORD their God, and worshiped other gods and served them.” ¹⁰Do not weep for him who is dead, nor bemoan him; weep rather for him who goes away, for he shall return no more to see his native land. ¹¹For thus says the LORD concerning Shallum son of King Josiah of Judah,

who succeeded his father Josiah, and who went away from this place: He shall return here no more, ¹²but in the place where they have carried him captive he shall die, and he shall never see this land again. ¹³Woe to him who builds his house by unrighteousness, and his upper rooms by injustice; who makes his neighbors work for nothing, and does not give them their wages; ¹⁴who says, "I will build myself a spacious house with large upper rooms," and who cuts out windows for it, paneling it with cedar, and painting it with vermilion. ¹⁵Are you a king because you compete in cedar? Did not your father eat and drink and do justice and righteousness? Then it was well with him. ¹⁶He judged the cause of the poor and needy; then it was well. Is not this to know me? says the LORD.

¹Así dijo Jehová: Desciende a la casa del rey de Judá, y habla allí esta palabra, ²y di: Oye palabra de Jehová, oh rey de Judá que estás sentado sobre el trono de David, tú, y tus siervos, y tu pueblo que entra por estas puertas. ³Así ha dicho Jehová: Haced juicio y justicia, y librad al oprimido de mano del opresor, y no engañéis ni robéis al extranjero, ni al huérfano ni a la viuda, ni derramáis sangre inocente en este lugar. ⁴Porque si efectivamente obedeciereis esta palabra, los reyes que en lugar de David se sientan sobre su trono, entrarán montados en carros y en caballos por las puertas de esta casa; ellos, y sus criados y su pueblo. ⁵Mas si no oyereis estas palabras, por mí mismo he jurado, dice Jehová, que esta casa será desierta. ⁶Porque así ha dicho Jehová acerca de la casa del rey de Judá: Como Galaad eres tú para mí, y como la cima del Líbano; sin embargo, te convertiré en soledad, y como ciudades deshabitadas. ⁷Prepararé contra ti destruidores, cada uno con sus armas, y cortarán tus cedros escogidos y los echarán en el fuego. ⁸Y muchas gentes pasarán junto a esta ciudad, y dirán cada uno a su compañero: ¿Por qué hizo así Jehová con esta gran ciudad? ⁹Y se les responderá: Porque dejaron el pacto de Jehová su Dios, y adoraron dioses ajenos y les sirvieron. ¹⁰No lloréis al muerto, ni de él os condoláis; llorad amargamente por el que se va, porque no volverá jamás, ni verá la tierra donde nació. ¹¹Porque así ha dicho Jehová acerca de Salum hijo de Josías, rey de Judá, el cual reinó en lugar de Josías su padre, y que salió de este lugar: No volverá más aquí, ¹²sino que morirá en el lugar adonde lo llevaron cautivo, y no verá más esta tierra. ¹³!Ay del que edifica su casa sin justicia, y sus salas sin equidad, sirviéndose de su prójimo de balde, y no dándole el salario de su trabajo! ¹⁴Que dice: Edificaré para mí casa espaciosa, y salas airosas; y le abre ventanas, y la cubre de cedro, y la pinta de bermellón. ¹⁵¿Reinarás, porque te rodeas de cedro? ¿No comió y bebió tu padre, e hizo juicio y justicia, y entonces le fue bien? ¹⁶El juzgó la causa del afligido y del menesteroso, y entonces estuvo bien. ¿No es esto conocerme a mí? dice Jehová.

¹ Después de estas cosas, designó el Señor también a otros setenta, a quienes envió de dos en dos delante de él a toda ciudad y lugar adonde él había de ir. ² Y les decía: La mies a la verdad es mucha, mas los obreros pocos; por tanto, rogad al Señor de la mies que envíe obreros a su mies. ³ Id; he aquí yo os envío como corderos en medio de lobos. ⁴ No llevéis bolsa, ni alforja, ni calzado; y a nadie saludéis por el camino. ⁵ En cualquier casa donde entréis, primeramente decid: Paz sea a esta casa. ⁶ Y si hubiere allí algún hijo de paz, vuestra paz reposará sobre él; y si no, se volverá a vosotros. ⁷ Y posad en aquella misma casa, comiendo y bebiendo lo que os den; porque el obrero es digno de su salario. No os paséis de casa en casa. ⁸ En cualquier ciudad donde entréis, y os reciban, comed lo que os pongan delante; ⁹ y sanad a los enfermos que en ella haya, y decidles: Se ha acercado a vosotros el reino de Dios. ¹⁰ Mas en cualquier ciudad donde entréis, y no os reciban, saliendo por sus calles, decid: ¹¹ Aun el polvo de vuestra ciudad, que se ha pegado a nuestros pies, lo sacudimos contra vosotros. Pero esto sabed, que el reino de Dios se ha acercado a vosotros. ¹² Y os digo que en aquel día será más tolerable el castigo para Sodoma, que para aquella ciudad.

¹After this the Lord appointed seventy others and sent them on ahead of him in pairs to every town and place where he himself intended to go. ²He said to them: The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest.

³Go on your way. See, I am sending you out like lambs into the midst of wolves. ⁴Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and greet no one on the road. ⁵Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this house!' ⁶And if anyone is there who shares in peace, your peace will rest on that person; but if not, it will return to you. ⁷Remain in the same house, eating and drinking whatever they provide, for the laborer deserves to be paid. Do not move about from house to house. ⁸Whenever you enter a town and its people welcome you, eat what is set before you; ⁹cure the sick who are there, and say to them, 'The kingdom of God has come near to you.' ¹⁰But whenever you enter a town and they do not welcome you, go out into its streets and say, ¹¹'Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet, we wipe off in protest against you. Yet know this: the kingdom of God has come near.'
¹²I tell you, on that day it will be more tolerable for Sodom than for that town.
