

La Iglesia, en el continente latinoamericano, tiene mucho que decir acerca del hombre, sobre todo cuando mira al hombre: rostros de campesinos sin tierra, ultrajados y matados por las fuerzas y el poder; rostros de obreros despedidos sin causa, sin paga suficiente para sostener sus hogares; rostros de ancianos; rostros de marginados; rostros de habitantes de los tugurios; rostros de niños pobres que, ya desde su infancia, comienzan a sentir la mordida cruel de la injusticia social*, y para ellos parece que no hay porvenir, para ellos no habrá escuelas ni colegios ni universidad. Con qué derecho nosotros hemos catalogado a hombres de primera clase y hombres de segunda clase, cuando en la teología del hombre solo hay una clase: la de los hijos de Dios.

The Church in Latin American has much to say about humanity. The Church looks at [a] sad picture: faces of landless peasants mistreated and killed by the forces of power, faces of laborers arbitrarily dismissed and without a living wage for their families, faces of the elderly, faces of outcasts, faces of slum dwellers, faces of poor children who from infancy begin to feel the cruel sting of social injustice.* For them, it seems, there is no future --- no school, no high school, no university. By what right have we catalogued persons as first-class persons or second-class persons? In the theology of the human person there is only one class: children of God.

ORDINARY TIME. As summer winds down, our vacation days dwindle, and the weather cools to a deep cold, it can be easy to feel like the joy, warmth, and fun of the more exciting seasons have passed. On top of that, many of us will now turn our attention to the endless weeks of work and school that lie between us and the next break, the shorter less sunlit days that seem to fill quickly with unfinished tasks, and the angering and often despairing unjust political climate we find ourselves in. This is Ordinary Time. This is our new normal where anxiety, hopelessness, and the mundane chores of everyday life consume us. Yet in the midst of this ordinary time, we still know that extraordinary moments happen—babies are born and parents pass away, lifelong partners marry and college sweet hearts call it quits, old friends get new jobs around the corner and new friends move halfway around the world. Life continues and God is still here. God is here and God has a word for the highs, lows, and in between of this season too. This fall from September to November, we will listen for that word from God during this Ordinary Time. Each week we will study scripture that deals with the seemingly ordinary moments of human life—friendship, love, family, illness, mental health, relationships, grief, and suffering, so that we can discern together God’s extraordinary call on our life together.


