Una Lectura | Scripture Lesson

Mateo | Matthew 22:23-30

The same day [that Jesus taught about taxes] some Sadducees came to him, saying there is no resurrection; and they questioned him, saying, "Teacher, Moses said, 'If a man dies without having children, his brother shall marry the [widow] woman, and raise up offspring for his brother.' Now there were seven brothers among us; the first married, and without having offspring, leaving the woman to his brother. The same for the second, and the third, to the seventh. After everything, the woman died. In the resurrection, then, for which of the seven will she be wife? For they all had her."

Jesus answered them, "You all are wrong, because you know neither the scriptures nor the power of God. For in the resurrection they neither marry nor are given in marriage, rather they are like angels in heaven. And about the resurrection of the dead, have you all not read what was said to you by God, 'I am the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob?' God is God not of the dead, but of the living." And when the crowd heard it, they were astounded at his teaching.

El mismo día [que Jesús enseñó sobre los impuestos] se le acercaron unos saduceos, diciendo que esto no es resurrección; y le preguntaron, diciendo: Maestro, Moisés dijo: Si un hombre muere sin tener hijos, su hermano se casará con la mujer [viuda] y le dará descendencia a su hermano. Ahora bien, había siete hermanos entre nosotros; el primero casado, y sin tener descendencia, dejando a la mujer a su cuidado. Lo mismo para el segundo, y el tercero, hasta el séptimo. Después de todo, la mujer murió. En la resurrección, pues, ¿de cuál de los siete será mujer? Porque todos la tenían.

Jesús les respondió: “Todos vosotros estáis equivocados, porque no conocéis las Escrituras ni el poder de Dios. Porque en la resurrección ni se casan ni se dan en matrimonio, sino que son como ángeles en el cielo. Y acerca de la resurrección de los muertos, ¿no habéis leído lo que os dijo Dios: 'Yo soy el Dios de Abraham, el Dios de Isaac y el Dios de Jacob?' Dios no es Dios de muertos, sino de los vivos.” Y cuando la multitud lo oyó, se asombraron de su enseñanza.

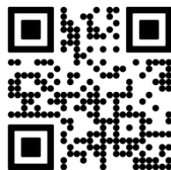

We are a multi-racial, multi-ethnic community of Christ followers committed to the sacred work of anti-racism, social justice, and radical inclusion.

OUR BELOVEDNESS | A Values Statement

We affirm that God celebrates the creative diversity of God's kin-dom, loving people of every color, faith, nationality, immigration status, sexual orientation, gender identity and expression, physical and cognitive ability, and economic status. It matters that people who have been historically marginalized by the Christian church in America see themselves listed here as God's beloved. In other words, **you** are our values statement.

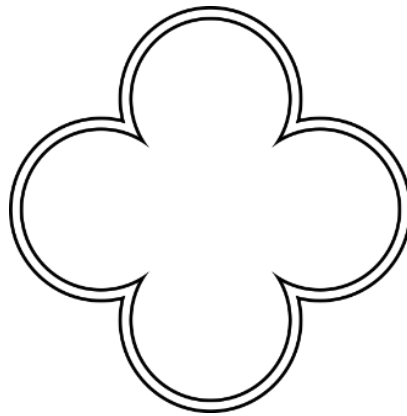
- We believe Black Lives Matter. Further still, Black Lives are precious and beloved by God. We are a church shaped by this profound theological statement. Until this is fully understood and expressed in the policies and practices of this nation's political and social life, it is essential for people of faith to keep saying, and living, this truth.
- We believe no human being is "illegal," and as a Sanctuary Church, we fully welcome and support people of all immigration statuses.
- We believe LGBTQ+ lives are sacred, beautiful, and ought to be fully included and affirmed in all aspects of congregational life and leadership.
- We celebrate that our worshipping life is multi-lingual and multi-dimensional, especially shaped by Latin American, particularly Salvadoran, traditions, and the Historic Black Church tradition.
- We value interfaith inclusion and welcome people of any and all faith traditions to find a home here.
- We value people for who they are and not for their role in an economy where wealth accumulates and people struggle to live.
- We acknowledge that we gather on the traditional land of the Piscataway, Anacostan, and Nacotchtank Peoples past and present, and honor with gratitude the land itself and the people who have stewarded it throughout the generations. We believe that the earth is sacred and that we must continue to learn how to be better caretakers of the land we inhabit.
- We value diverse theological voices which have long stood on the margins within the Christian tradition in America.

OUR HOLY IMAGINATION | A Vision Statement

We believe that Jesus identifies particularly with oppressed and marginalized people and invites us into radically inclusive community. As a historically white church with the sacred gift of now being a multiracial Christian community, we hear the clarion call to engage in the active and disruptive work of anti-racism and decolonization, both within ourselves and in the world.
