Special Called Business Meeting, Sunday, June 30 — As had been noted in previous quarterly business meetings, Girls Global Academy has been in the process of modifying their growth projection plan from ~400 to ~300 students. Because their funding is based on a per pupil allotment, any decision to modify the original lease and provide them rental relief to more closely meet their growth plan has financial implications for Calvary. The board and pastors have been assessing a good path forward and plan to present to the congregation a lease modification and rental relief plan at a called business meeting on Sunday, June 30. (The only reason we aren't waiting until our Quarterly Business Meeting is to aid GGA's timeline as they plan their budget this summer.) The board's presentation will also include a recommendation that the congregation vote to affirm their ability to perform the necessary transactions for the rental relief plan to go into effect beginning in July. We will certainly make space for any and all questions, concerns, etc., during the June 30 meeting, but if you'd like more time to learn the details and digest the information, please join us for a virtual information session on Tuesday, June 25th at 7 pm on Zoom. (You can use the usual virtual Sunday Zoom link to join. See adjacent QR code.)



- We celebrate that our worshipping life is multi-lingual and multi-dimensional, especially shaped by Latin American, particularly Salvadoran, traditions, and the Historic Black Church tradition.
