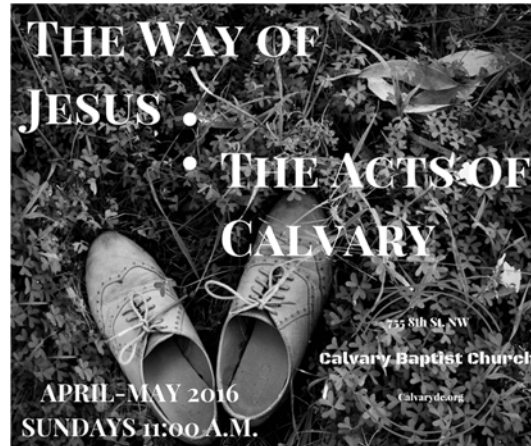

LISTENING FOR THE WORD OF GOD

ACTS OF THE APOSTLES

Acts/Hechos 9:1-20
Reverend Zehyoue

¹Saul, still breathing threats and murder against the disciples of the Lord, went to the high priest ²and asked him for letters to the synagogues at Damascus, so that if he found any who belonged to the Way, men or women, he might bring them bound to Jerusalem. ³Now as he was going along and approaching Damascus, suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him. ⁴He fell to the ground and heard a voice saying to him, 'Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?' ⁵He asked, 'Who are you, Lord?' The reply came, 'I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting. ⁶But get up and enter the city, and you will be told what you are to do.' ⁷The men who were travelling with him stood speechless because they heard the voice but saw no one. ⁸Saul got up from the ground, and though his eyes were open, he could see nothing; so they led him by the hand and brought him into Damascus. ⁹For three days he was without sight, and neither ate nor drank. ¹⁰Now there was a disciple in Damascus named Ananias. The Lord said to him in a vision, 'Ananias.' He answered, 'Here I am, Lord.' ¹¹The Lord said to him, 'Get up and go to the street called Straight, and at the house of Judas look for a man of Tarsus named Saul. At this moment he is praying, ¹²and he has seen in a vision a man named Ananias come in and lay his hands on him so that he might regain his sight.' ¹³But Ananias answered, 'Lord, I have heard from many about this man, how much evil he has done to your saints in Jerusalem; ¹⁴and here he has authority from the chief priests to bind all who invoke your name.' ¹⁵But the Lord said to him, 'Go, for he is an instrument whom I have chosen to bring my name before Gentiles and kings and before the people of Israel; ¹⁶I myself will show him how much he must suffer for the sake of my name.' ¹⁷So Ananias went and entered the house. He laid his hands on Saul and said, 'Brother Saul, the Lord Jesus, who appeared to you on your way here, has sent me so that you may regain your sight and be filled with the Holy Spirit.' ¹⁸And immediately something like scales fell from his eyes, and his sight was restored. Then he got up and was baptized, ¹⁹and after taking some food, he regained his strength. For several days he was with the disciples in Damascus, ²⁰and immediately he began to proclaim Jesus in the synagogues, saying, 'He is the Son of God.'

¹Saulo, respirando aún amenazas y muerte contra los discípulos del Señor, se presentó al sumo sacerdote, ²y le pidió cartas para las sinagogas de Damasco, a fin de que si hallaba algunos hombres o mujeres de este Camino, los trajese presos a Jerusalén. ³Mas yendo por el camino, aconteció que al llegar cerca de Damasco, repentinamente le rodeó un resplandor de luz del cielo; ⁴y cayendo en tierra, oyó una voz que le decía: Saulo, Saulo, ¿por qué me persigues? ⁵Él dijo: ¿Quién eres, Señor? Y le dijo: Yo soy Jesús, a quien tú persigues; dura cosa

te es dar coces contra el aguijón. ⁶Él, temblando y temeroso, dijo: Señor, ¿qué quieres que yo haga? Y el Señor le dijo: Levántate y entra en la ciudad, y se te dirá lo que debes hacer. ⁷Y los hombres que iban de camino con él, se pararon atónitos, oyendo a la verdad la voz, mas sin ver a nadie. ⁸Entonces Saulo se levantó del suelo, y aunque tenía abiertos los ojos, no veía a nadie; así que, llevándole de la mano, le metieron en Damasco, ⁹y estuvo tres días sin ver, y no comió ni bebió. ¹⁰Había entonces en Damasco un discípulo llamado Ananías, a quien el Señor dijo en visión: Ananías. Y él respondió: Heme aquí, Señor. ¹¹Y el Señor le dijo: Levántate, y ve a la calle que se llama Recta, y busca en casa de Judas a uno llamado Saulo, de Tarso; porque mira, está orando, ¹²y ha visto en visión a un varón llamado Ananías, que entra y le pone las manos encima para que recobre la vista. ¹³Entonces Ananías respondió: Señor, he oído de muchos acerca de este hombre, cuántos males ha hecho a tus santos en Jerusalén; ¹⁴y aquí tiene autoridad de los principales sacerdotes para prender a todos los que invocan tu nombre. ¹⁵El Señor le dijo: Ve, porque instrumento escogido me es éste, para llevar mi nombre en presencia de los gentiles, y de reyes, y de los hijos de Israel; ¹⁶porque yo le mostraré cuánto es menester que padezca por mi nombre. ¹⁷Fue entonces Ananías y entró en la casa, y poniendo sobre él las manos, dijo: Hermano Saulo, el Señor Jesús, que se te apareció en el camino por donde venías, me ha enviado para que recobres la vista y seas lleno del Espíritu Santo. ¹⁸Y al momento cayeron de sus ojos como escamas, y recobró al instante la vista; se levantó y fue bautizado. ¹⁹Y habiendo tomado alimento, recobró fuerzas. Y estuvo Saulo por algunos días con los discípulos que había en Damasco. ²⁰Y en seguida se puso a predicar a Cristo en las sinagogas, diciendo que éste era el Hijo de Dios.

EPISTLE LESSON

Apocalipsis/Revelation 5:11-14

¹¹Y vi, y oí la voz de muchos ángeles alrededor del trono, y de los seres vivientes, y de los ancianos; y su número era miríadas de miríadas, y millares de millares, ¹²que decían a gran voz: El Cordero que ha sido inmolado es digno de tomar el poder, las riquezas, la sabiduría, la fortaleza, el honor, la gloria y la alabanza. ¹³Y a todo lo creado que está en el cielo, y sobre la tierra, y debajo de la tierra, y en el mar, y a todas las cosas que hay en ellos, oí decir: Al que está sentado en el trono, y al Cordero, sea la alabanza, el honor, la gloria y el dominio, por los siglos de los siglos. ¹⁴Y los cuatro seres vivientes decían: Amén; y los veinticuatro ancianos se postraron sobre sus rostros y adoraron al que vive por los siglos de los siglos.

¹¹Then I looked, and I heard the voice of many angels surrounding the throne and the living creatures and the elders; they numbered myriads of myriads and thousands of thousands, ¹²singing with full voice, 'Worthy is the Lamb that was slaughtered to receive power and wealth and wisdom and might and honor and glory and blessing!' ¹³Then I heard every creature in heaven and on earth and under the earth and in the sea, and all that is in them, singing, 'To the one seated on the throne and to the Lamb be blessing and honor and glory and might for ever and ever!' ¹⁴And the four living creatures said, 'Amen!' And the elders fell down and worshipped.

¹After these things Jesus showed himself again to the disciples by the Sea of Tiberias; and he showed himself in this way. ²Gathered there together were Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two others of his disciples. ³Simon Peter said to them, 'I am going fishing.' They said to him, 'We will go with you.' They went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. ⁴Just after daybreak, Jesus stood on the beach; but the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. ⁵Jesus said to them, 'Children, you have no fish, have you?' They answered him, 'No.' ⁶He said to them, 'Cast the net to the right side of the boat, and you will find some.' So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in because there were so many fish. ⁷That disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, 'It is the Lord!' When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on some clothes, for he was naked, and jumped into the lake. ⁸But the other disciples came in the boat, dragging the net full of fish, for they were not far from the land, only about a hundred yards off. ⁹When they had gone ashore, they saw a charcoal fire there, with fish on it, and bread. ¹⁰Jesus said to them, 'Bring some of the fish that you have just caught.' ¹¹So Simon Peter went aboard and hauled the net ashore, full of large fish, a hundred and fifty-three of them; and though there were so many, the net was not torn. ¹²Jesus said to them, 'Come and have breakfast.' Now none of the disciples dared to ask him, 'Who are you?' because they knew it was the Lord. ¹³Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and did the same with the fish. ¹⁴This was now the third time that Jesus appeared to the disciples after he was raised from the dead. ¹⁵When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, 'Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?' He said to him, 'Yes, Lord; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my lambs.' ¹⁶A second time he said to him, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' He said to him, 'Yes, Lord; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Tend my sheep.' ¹⁷He said to him the third time, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' Peter felt hurt because he said to him the third time, 'Do you love me?' And he said to him, 'Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my sheep. ¹⁸Very truly, I tell you, when you were younger, you used to fasten your own belt and to go wherever you wished. But when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will fasten a belt around you and take you where you do not wish to go.' ¹⁹(He said this to indicate the kind of death by which he would glorify God.) After this he said to him, 'Follow me.'

¹Después de esto, Jesús se manifestó otra vez a sus discípulos junto al mar de Tiberíades; y se manifestó de esta manera: ²Estaban juntos Simón Pedro, Tomás llamado el Mellizo, Natanael el de Caná de Galilea, los hijos de Zebedeo, y otros dos de sus discípulos. ³Simón Pedro les dijo: Voy a pescar. Ellos le dijeron: Vamos nosotros también contigo. Fueron, y entraron en una barca; y aquella noche no pescaron nada. ⁴Cuando ya iba amaneciendo, se presentó Jesús en la playa; mas los discípulos no sabían que era Jesús. ⁵Y les dijo: Hijitos, ¿tenéis algo de comer? Le respondieron: No. ⁶Él les dijo: Echad la red a la derecha de la barca, y hallaréis. Entonces la echaron, y ya no la podían sacar, por la gran cantidad de peces. ⁷Entonces aquel discípulo a quien Jesús amaba dijo a Pedro: ¡Es el Señor! Simón Pedro, cuando oyó que era el Señor, se ciñó la ropa (porque se había despojado de ella), y se echó al mar. ⁸Y los otros discípulos vinieron con la barca, arrastrando la red de peces, pues no distaban de tierra sino como doscientos codos. ⁹Al descender a tierra, vieron unas brasas puestas, y un pez encima de ellas, y pan. ¹⁰Jesús les dijo: Traed de los peces que acabáis de pescar. ¹¹Subió Simón Pedro, y sacó la red a tierra, llena de grandes peces, ciento cincuenta y tres; y aun siendo tantos, no se rompió la red. ¹²Les dijo Jesús: Venid, comed. Y ninguno de los discípulos se atrevía a preguntarle: ¿Tú, quién eres?, sabiendo que era el Señor. ¹³Vino, pues, Jesús, y tomó el pan y les dio, y asimismo del pescado. ¹⁴Ésta era ya la tercera vez que Jesús se manifestaba a sus discípulos, después de haber resucitado de los muertos. ¹⁵Después de haber comido, Jesús dijo a Simón Pedro: Simón, hijo de Jonás, ¿me amas más que éstos? Le respondió: Sí, Señor;

tú sabes que te amo. Él le dijo: Apacienta mis corderos. ¹⁶Volvió a decirle la segunda vez: Simón, hijo de Jonás, ¿me amas? Pedro le respondió: Sí, Señor; tú sabes que te amo. Le dijo: Pastorea mis ovejas. ¹⁷Le dijo la tercera vez: Simón, hijo de Jonás, ¿me amas? Pedro se entristeció de que le dijese por tercera vez: ¿Me amas?, y le respondió: Señor, tú lo sabes todo; tú sabes que te amo. Jesús le dijo: Apacienta mis ovejas. ¹⁸De cierto, de cierto te digo: Cuando eras más joven, te ceñías tú mismo, e ibas adonde querías; mas cuando ya seas viejo, extenderás tus manos, y te ceñirá otro, y te llevará adonde no quieras. ¹⁹Esto dijo, dando a entender con qué muerte había de glorificar a Dios. Y dicho esto, añadió: Sígueme.

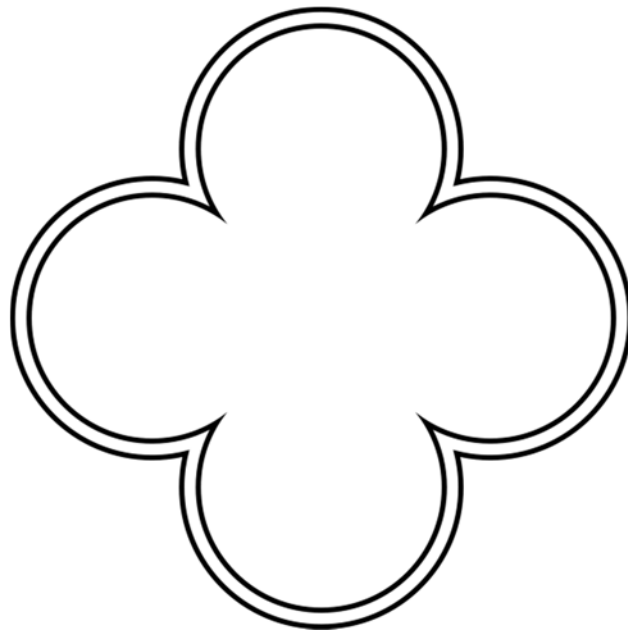
