<sup>1</sup>Arise, shine; for your light has come, and the glory of the LORD has risen upon you. <sup>2</sup>For darkness shall cover the earth, and thick darkness the peoples; but the LORD will arise upon you, and his glory will appear over you. <sup>3</sup>Nations shall come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn. <sup>4</sup>Lift up your eyes and look around; they all gather together, they come to you; your sons shall come from far away, and your daughters shall be carried on their nurses' arms. <sup>5</sup>Then you shall see and be radiant; your heart shall thrill and rejoice, because the abundance of the sea shall be brought to you, the wealth of the nations shall come to you. <sup>6</sup>A multitude of camels shall cover you, the young camels of Midian and Ephah; all those from Sheba shall come. They shall bring gold and frankincense, and shall proclaim the praise of the LORD.

<sup>1</sup> Cuando Jesús nació en Belén de Judea en días del rey Herodes, vinieron del oriente a Jerusalén unos magos, <sup>2</sup> diciendo: ¿Dónde está el rey de los judíos, que ha nacido? Porque su estrella hemos visto en el oriente, y venimos a adorarle. <sup>3</sup> Oyendo esto, el rey Herodes se turbó, y toda Jerusalén con él. <sup>4</sup> Y convocados todos los principales sacerdotes, y los escribas del pueblo, les preguntó dónde había de nacer el Cristo. <sup>5</sup> Ellos le dijeron: En Belén de Judea; porque así está escrito por el profeta: <sup>6</sup> Y tú, Belén, de la tierra de Judá, no eres la más pequeña entre los príncipes de Judá; Porque de ti saldrá un guiador, que apacentará a mi pueblo Israel. <sup>7</sup> Entonces Herodes, llamando en secreto a los magos, indagó de ellos diligentemente el tiempo de la aparición de la estrella; <sup>8</sup> y enviándolos a Belén, dijo: Id allá y averiguad con diligencia acerca del niño; y cuando le halléis, hacédmelo saber, para que yo también vaya y le adore. <sup>9</sup> Ellos, habiendo oído al rey, se fueron; y he aquí la estrella que habían visto en el oriente iba delante de ellos, hasta que llegando, se detuvo sobre donde estaba el niño. <sup>10</sup> Y al ver la estrella, se regocijaron con muy grande gozo. <sup>11</sup> Y al entrar en la casa, vieron al niño con su madre María, y postrándose, lo adoraron; y abriendo sus tesoros, le ofrecieron presentes: oro, incienso y mirra. <sup>12</sup> Pero siendo avisados por revelación en sueños que no volvieran a Herodes, regresaron a su tierra por otro camino.

<sup>1</sup> In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, <sup>2</sup> asking, “Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage.” <sup>3</sup> When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; <sup>4</sup> and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. <sup>5</sup> They told him, “In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet: <sup>6</sup> ‘And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel.’” <sup>7</sup> Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. <sup>8</sup> Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, “Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage.” <sup>9</sup> When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. <sup>10</sup> When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. <sup>11</sup> On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage.

Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.  
<sup>12</sup> And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

Our elected officials, entrusted with the power to make decisions in the best interest of us all, as DACA legislation impacts our friends and neighbors.

**A CROWN PLACED OVER OUR HEADS: FOLLOWING JESUS AND MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. FROM EPIPHANY TO EASTER.** Just a few days after Easter this year, this nation will mark fifty years since Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s assassination (April 4, 1968). Institutions as diverse as local unions, church denominations, colleges and universities, peace groups, Civil Rights Organizations, and even our national government will pause to honor his life. Because his contributions were so wide ranging, he will be remembered in a number of different ways by these different groups. Some will remember him for his work as a radical Black political activist, others will remember him as a social reformer, quite a few will remember him as an international peacemaker, while many others will remember his contributions to the labor movement, African decolonization, and interfaith relations. As all of these other groups remember him 50 years after his death, we seek to ask, "How should the church remember him?" This holy season spanning Epiphany to Easter, we will remember Dr. King by lifting up his embodied theology—a theology of justice, love, mercy, mutuality, and beloved community. We will pair King's familiar words with stories about Jesus—his baptism, transfiguration, ministry, life, death, and resurrection. In our lives and our liturgy, we will be challenged by these two Kings to stretch towards "the crowns placed over our heads," in the words of the theologian and mystic Howard Thurman, as we aspire to live into our own Belovedness and claim it for the world.
